Collegiate Football Memory: Will be stepping on to our football field for the first time as a Hawk this fall

Talk about the work that has gone into starting a club football program at your school:

A lot of work has gone into starting a club football program at UMES since it will be the first of many club sports to come. There was and is still a great deal of responsibility in establishing our program because our Vice Presi-

dent of Student Life wanted our program to be the model that future club sports at UMES to follow. First, we needed to know what is a club sport, how it is different from NCAA or intramural sports. We worked closely with our Office of Student Life to define our dub football program from writing the constitution to eliminating our liability issues. We also had to work with other departments on campus such as the Physical Plant to assist in maintaining our field, buying new field goal post, and securing an equipment room. Unlike most club football programs that are just getting started, we did not have a heavy financial burden. We had a fund that was started some years ago by alumni to bring football back to UMES. I am pleased with where we are as a club having just gotten the green light this past spring to get estab-

What excites you the most about joining the NCFA?

The opportunity to network with individuals from other universities that love the game of football.

What is your outlook for your team this season?

I believe we are probably one of the most talented teams in the league, but I know self-discipline will be the key to our success. The majority of our players come from major metropolitan areas on the east coast where there is a lot of talent. If we combine self-discipline with our talent we will be a force to be reckoned with in the league. Our goal is the same as everyone in the league: to win the first NCFA National Championship Bowl Game.

Anything else you would like to add?

This whole experience as being president of our club football program has made me a better person despite all the obstacles I have overcome. Most people have told me that this is preparation for the future. I would like to thank the NCFA for this opportunity and that it is always a pleasure working with you guys.
