2025 NCBA Cortland Fall Invitational Registration

The NCBA is excited to open up registration for the inaugural Cortland Fall Invitational, taking place in Cortland, NY. This event will take place **October 24-26, 2025**. We are expecting to have a total of 8 teams compete in Pool Play (2 Pools of 4 teams) with the top 2 teams from each pool moving onto a Single Elimination Tournament where the eventual champion will be crowned.

- Games will be played at Gutchess Lumber Sports Complex – Cortland, NY.
- All games are 7-innings in length & will count as exhibition.
- Each registered team is guaranteed 3 pool play games. Top 2 teams from each pool will advance to Sunday's single elimination.
- Cost of the tournament is \$565 - due no later than 10/1/2025.
- The Registration Fee covers all field usage, umpires & baseballs for the tournament.
- **We will accept the first 8 Registration Forms that are received.**

By filling out this form and sending it in, you are reserving your spot and agreeing to participate in the 2025 Cortland Fall Invitational.

You are also committing to the following...

- Reading to the tournament guidelines listed after this registration form
- Playing 1 pool play game Fri. Oct. 24th, 2 pool play games Sat. Oct. 25th with all single elimination qualifiers Sun. Oct. 26th (max 2 games).
- Paying the Registration Fee by the above said date of 10/1/25. **Fee is not refundable.**
- Staying in an Official NCBA Host Hotel(s) & reserving rooms through specified reservation process by the cut-off date.
 - **You must also reserve the rooms by the methods specified by the NCBA. No 3rd party reservations can be made through Expedia, Travelocity etc.**
 - **Should you not require hotel rooms (commuting) or would like to opt out of booking with NCBA partnered hotels, you will be required to pay \$400 opt-out fee in addition to the \$565 registration fee.**

*If any of these above conditions are not met, the team will be removed from participating in the event without refund.

Tournament Guidelines

Rules

- 1) All games played will be governed by the 2026 NCBA Division I rulebook with the following exceptions.
 - Games are 7 innings. 10 after 5 is in effect. Last batted out begins on 2nd in extras.
 - Any and all roster rules do not apply (6.00.00)
 - Any and all eligibility rules do not apply (7.00.00)
 - Any and all academic eligibility rules do not apply (8.00.00)
 - **We will be lenient on the uniform rules, but we do expect all teams to be in matching uniforms and looking professional.**

*While roster, eligibility and academic eligibility rules will not be enforced, we do expect teams to treat these games as official NCBA games (i.e. using players that would meet typical NCBA roster, eligibility and academic eligibility requirements/rules).

The following criteria will be used to determine pool standing:

1. The first criterion for determining pool standing is pool-play winning percentage.
2. The first tiebreaker for determining pool standing is pool game head to head results.
 - In the scenario where 3 teams finish 2-1 & criteria #2 is not applicable, criteria #3 will be used.
3. The next tiebreaker for determining pool standing is the lower number of total runs allowed during pool play.
 - In the scenario where 3 teams finish 2-1 & 2 or more of them also share the least number of runs allowed, those teams sharing the same # of runs allowed will be evaluated using criteria #4 below.
4. The next tiebreaker for determining pool standing is higher run differential during pool play.
 - In the scenario where 3 teams finish 2-1 & 2 or more of them also share the same run differential, those teams will be evaluated using criteria #5 below.
5. The final tiebreaker for determining pool standing will be a coin flip.

Once the Pool Champion is declared, the process for determining the 2nd place team will be determined by the same criteria, beginning with #1 from above.

Single elimination format:

Semi-Final #1 - Pool A Champion vs. Pool B Runner-Up

Semi-Final #2 - Pool B Champion vs. Pool A Runner-Up

Semi-Final winners play for Championship.

In case of inclement weather or darkness the following rules will be in effect:

4.03.6 If the score is tied at the end of five or more full innings OR if five full innings have not been played when the official declares the game must be stopped due to weather or darkness, a HALTED GAME RULE will be in effect.

4.03.6.1 A game that has been stopped prior to five or more full innings being played OR before a winner can be declared because of inclement weather, darkness, light failure or curfew will be continued at the next available opportunity as set forth by the Tournament Director.

4.03.6.2 A halted game must resume play at exactly the point of being halted, with the lineups and batting orders of both teams exactly the same, subject to the rules of substitution; any player (or pitcher) who played, or was announced as a substitute before the game was halted, must be in the lineup when play resumes or be ineligible for the remainder of the game.

Other items:

- Be at your game a minimum of 30 minutes prior to the official start time of your game. Game times may be moved up if the previous game finishes early. Be in touch with the director at your field for the most up to date start time.
- Teams must provide their own ice and water.
- Teams are responsible for locating and retrieving foul balls. NO BALLS = NO PLAY
- The NCBA will provide game balls for the tournament.
- Keep in mind you are representing not only yourselves and your university but the NCBA as well. Act responsibly at the fields and at the hotel.
